Truth & Reconciliation Commitment

As part of our ongoing commitment to Truth & Reconciliation Lord Beaverbrook High School, led by grade 10, 11 and 12 leadership students, have created a prominent display that honours Survivors, their families, and communities. This display consists of 215 pairs of children's shoes, each of which will symbolically represent one of the 215 children confirmed to be buried at the former Kamloops Indian Residential School in May 2021.

To support with this project, we are asking for donations of new or like-new children's footwear. Donations can be brought to the main office. We will be seeking the advice of Indigenous Elders to determine how long the display should remain. When the time comes to take it down, the shoes will be donated to local organizations who provide clothing to Indigenous youth in need.

School Fees
